


What is a skill?

Different kinds of skills



Digital skills are knowledge and skills required by individual for optimal use of information and communication technologies

A digital skill could be a

- 1. Low-income digital skill**
- 2. High-income digital skill**

The difference?

Low income digital skills are easier to learn with very short courses. They require basic skills e.g graphics design, content writing, copywriting, social media marketing etc.

while

High-income digital skills require very long course or a degree. It involves long term learning e.g programming, data science, machine learning etc.

The longer it takes to learn a skill, the higher the rewards
